## A Pastor is an Elder, Bishop, Overseer, and Steward

- I. The titles pastor, elder, bishop, overseer, and steward are all names for the same office.
  - A. <u>Pastor</u> *Etymology* L. pastor-em shepherd, lit. 'feeder, giver of pasture', 1. A herdsman or shepherd. 2. A shepherd of souls; one who has the spiritual **oversight** over a company or body of Christians, as **bishop**, priest, minister, etc.; spec. the minister in charge of a church or congregation, with particular reference to the spiritual care of his 'flock'.
  - B. <u>Elder</u> B. n. An elder person, lit. and fig. 1. a. A parent; an ancestor, forefather; hence, in wider sense, a predecessor, one who lived in former days. 4. a. In ecclesiastical use. ...the title given to a certain order or class of office-bearers in the early Christian Church....
  - C. Bishop 1. A spiritual superintendent or **overseer** in the Christian Church.
  - D. <u>Overseer</u> 1. a. One who oversees or superintends, a supervisor; esp. one whose business it is to superintend a piece of work, or a body of workmen; a superintendent (of workmen, slaves, convicts, etc.).
  - E. An elder is a bishop (**Tit 1:5-7**).
    - 1. **Tit 1:5** For this cause left I thee in Crete, that thou shouldest set in order the things that are wanting, and ordain elders in every city, as I had appointed thee:
    - 2. **Tit 1:6** If any be blameless, the husband of one wife, having faithful children not accused of riot or unruly.
    - 3. **Tit 1:7** For a bishop must be blameless, as the steward of God; not selfwilled, not soon angry, not given to wine, no striker, not given to filthy lucre;
  - F. An elder is an overseer (Act 20:17 c/w Act 20:28).
    - 1. Act 20:17 And from Miletus he sent to Ephesus, and called the elders of the church.
    - 2. **Act 20:28** Take heed therefore unto yourselves, and to all the flock, over the which the Holy Ghost hath made you <u>overseers</u>, to feed the church of God, which he hath purchased with his own blood.

    - 1. Act 20:17 And from Miletus he sent to Ephesus, and called the elders of the church.
    - 2. **Act 20:28** Take heed therefore unto yourselves, and to all <u>the flock</u>, over the which the Holy Ghost hath made you overseers, to <u>feed the church of God</u>, which he hath purchased with his own blood.
    - 3. **1Pe 5:1** The elders which are among you I exhort, who am also an elder, and a witness of the sufferings of Christ, and also a partaker of the glory that shall be revealed:
    - 4. **1Pe 5:2** <u>Feed the flock</u> of God which is among you, taking the oversight thereof, not by constraint, but willingly; not for filthy lucre, but of a ready mind;

    - 1. **Tit 1:7** For a bishop must be blameless, as <u>the steward of God</u>; not selfwilled, not soon angry, not given to wine, no striker, not given to filthy lucre;
    - 2. <u>Steward</u> 1. a. An official who controls the domestic affairs of a household, supervising the service of his master's table, directing the domestics, and regulating household expenditure; a major-domo.
