The Not-Living Translation

- I. The New Living Translation should be called the Not Living Translation.
- II. The Not-Living Translation corrupts the doctrine of the Trinity.
 - 1. 1Jo 5:7
 - A. **KJV** "For there are three that bear record <u>in heaven, the Father, the Word, and</u> <u>the Holy Ghost: and these three are one</u>." (**1Jo 5:7**)
 - B. NLT "So we have these three witnesses" (1Jo 5:7)
- III. The Not-Living Translation corrupts the doctrine of the deity of Jesus Christ.
 - 1. 1Ti 3:16
 - A. **KJV** "And without controversy great is the mystery of godliness: <u>God</u> was manifest in the flesh..." (**1Ti 3:16**)
 - B. NLT "Without question, this is the great mystery of our faith: <u>Christ</u> was revealed in a human body..." (1Ti 3:16)
 - 2. Eph 3:9
 - A. **KJV** "And to make all men see what is the fellowship of the mystery, which from the beginning of the world hath been hid in God, <u>who created all things by</u> <u>Jesus Christ</u>:" (**Eph 3:9**)
 - B. NLT "I was chosen to explain to everyone this mysterious plan that God, the Creator of all things, had kept secret from the beginning." (Eph 3:9)
- IV. The Not-Living Translation corrupts the doctrine of the preservation of the scriptures.
 - 1. Psa 12:6-7
 - A. **KJV** "<u>The words</u> of the Lord are <u>pure words</u>: as silver tried in a furnace of earth, purified seven times. 7) <u>Thou shalt keep them, O Lord, thou shalt preserve them from this generation for ever</u>." (**Psa 12:6-7**)
 - B. **NLT** "The Lord's promises are pure, like silver refined in a furnace, purified seven times over. 7) Therefore, Lord, we know you will protect <u>the oppressed</u>, preserving them forever from this lying generation," (**Psa 12:6-7**)
- V. The Not-Living Translation corrupts the doctrine of baptism.
 - 1. Act 8:36-38
 - A. KJV "36) And as they went on their way, they came unto a certain water: and the eunuch said, See, here is water; what doth hinder me to be baptized? <u>37) And Philip said, If thou believest with all thine heart, thou mayest. And he answered and said, I believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God.</u> 38) And he commanded the chariot to stand still: and they went down both into the water, both Philip and the eunuch; and he baptized him." (Act 8:36-38)
 - B. NLT "36) As they rode along, they came to some water, and the eunuch said, "Look! There's some water! Why can't I be baptized?" [verse 37 missing] 38) He ordered the carriage to stop, and they went down into the water, and Philip baptized him." (Act 8:36-38)
- VI. The Not-Living Translation removes all references to the word "sodomite".
 - 1. Deu 23:17
 - A. **KJV** "There shall be no whore of the daughters of Israel, nor a <u>sodomite</u> of the sons of Israel." (**Deu 23:17**)
 - B. NLT ""No Israelite, whether man or woman, may become a <u>temple prostitute</u>." (Deu 23:17)
 - 2. 1Ki 14:24

- A. KJV "And there were also <u>sodomites</u> in the land: and they did according to all the abominations of the nations which the Lord cast out before the children of Israel." (1Ki 14:24)
- B. **NLT** "There were even <u>male and female shrine prostitutes</u> throughout the land. The people imitated the detestable practices of the pagan nations the Lord had driven from the land ahead of the Israelites." (**1Ki 14:24**)
- 3. 1Ki 15:12
 - A. **KJV** "And he took away the <u>sodomites</u> out of the land, and removed all the idols that his fathers had made." (**1Ki 15:12**)
 - B. NLT "He banished the <u>male and female shrine prostitutes</u> from the land and got rid of all the idols his ancestors had made." (1Ki 15:12)
- 4. 2Ki 23:7
 - A. **KJV** "And he brake down the houses of the <u>sodomites</u>, that were by the house of the Lord, where the women wove hangings for the grove." (**2Ki 23:7**)
 - B. **NLT** "He also tore down the living quarters of the <u>male and female shrine</u> <u>prostitutes</u> that were inside the Temple of the Lord, where the women wove coverings for the Asherah pole." (**2Ki 23:7**)
- VII. The Not-Living Translation removes all references to the word "fornication".
 - 1. <u>Fornication</u> *n*. Voluntary sexual intercourse between a man (in restricted use, an unmarried man) and an unmarried woman. In Scripture extended to adultery.
 - 2. 1Co 6:18
 - A. **KJV** "Flee <u>fornication</u>. Every sin that a man doeth is without the body; but he that committeth <u>fornication</u> sinneth against his own body." (**1Co 6:18**)
 - B. NLT "Run from <u>sexual sin</u>! No other sin so clearly affects the body as this one does. For <u>sexual immorality</u> is a sin against your own body." (1Co 6:18)
 - 3. 1Th 4:3
 - A. **KJV** "For this is the will of God, even your sanctification, that ye should abstain from <u>fornication</u>:" (**1Th 4:3**)
 - B. NLT "God's will is for you to be holy, so stay away from all <u>sexual sin</u>." (1Th 4:3)
